

be that for those of us who have accepted the events that
took place there as the only source of salvation, there is a
special connection.

Calvary is a symbol of suffering; something we all can
identify with. Jesus even told us that we would suffer if we
followed Him. Nonetheless, suffering is something most of
us struggle with. We just do not like pain, agony or discom-
fort. To enter into the fellowship of His suffering is some-
thing we avoid if we can.

Even when we understand that as Christians we will suf-
fer, we don't really understand the sufficient. It is not an
"uphill" battle as some songs suggest. Calvary was a
MOUNTAIN! So we need the strength to claim.

Jesus had to "carry" that heavy cross beam up a moun-
tain; not a hill! I was reminded of this while going through a
personal "pity party." I have not had to bear the "sins" of
the world. In fact, my burdens are light compared to Jesus.
So I pray:

"Lord, forgive me when I complain about these little hills
of life. Help me to focus on all the blessings you have given
me and not the burdens I must bear. Remind me to give
thanks instead of complaining."

What Does Giving Cost You
