## *He Has Risen (Easter)*

**Luke 24:1-12, 30-35**

Last week we concluded our study of Unit I, Follow in My Ways. We studied how The Lord Will Provide from Genesis; A Prayer of Dedication, Worshipping in God's Temple and Seeking His Face, all from II Chronicles. We begin to learn that as we Acknowledge God, one thing we must do is follow in His ways.

Today we begin to study Unit II, All Glory and Honor. Our first lesson is from Luke 24, He Has Risen (Easter). Luke is said to be the longest book in the New Testament. The author is not named however, it is believed to be the Apostle Luke. Luke is also given authorship to the book of Acts. These two books connect. In fact, many refer to the book of Acts as Luke II.

The Holman Study Bible says, *“The Gospel of Luke is a carefully researched...selective presentation of the person and life of Jesus Christ, designed to strengthen the faith of believers...and to challenge the misconceptions of unbelievers, especially those from a Greek background. Its portrait of Jesus is well-balanced, skillfully emphasizing His divinity and perfect humanity.”*

The opening chapters of Luke deal first with Jesus as He prepared for ministry. Chapters 1-4 pour the foundation of His short life and ministry. As He prepared to serve He was confronted by the devil in chapter 4. In Chapter 5 to 19 we find Him doing the work of His Father. Many miracles were witnessed as well as healings. In Chapter 19 He made His final approach to Jerusalem. His ministry began to be challenged. He knew His mission and foretold of His coming persecution and crucifixion. In Chapter 23 He was crucified and buried. Thank God for Chapter 24. Something happened, and things changed.

Our lesson today comes from Chapter 24. May the Holy Spirit speak through our teacher as we study the lesson, He Has Risen.
